

Information for Families of Newly Arrived Allophone Students

We collect personal data to facilitate your children's schooling. This data is stored in a secure application. This document explains the law and your rights.

Personal data and the law

Personal data includes all information that relates to you: your name, address, phone number, email address, the languages you speak, etc. In the European Union, data protection is a fundamental right. Laws regulate the use of this data to ensure it is processed fairly, legally, and transparently:

• In the European Union: the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR); • In France: the 'Informatique et Libertés' law.

These laws enable you to control the use of your personal data.

What will this data be used for?

The purposes of data processing are: to assign and enrol newly arrived allophone students; to consider their needs in learning French throughout their schooling; and to follow up allophone students.

What are your rights regarding this data?

You have several rights regarding your personal data and that of your child. You have the right to:

be informed about the use of your personal data.

access your personal data used in this processing.

object to the processing of data in certain cases,

request the erasure of personal data that is no longer necessary

request the rectification of inaccurate personal data.

If you think that the processing of your child's personal data infringes upon your rights, you may file a complaint with the French Data Protection Authority (CNIL)
